




News Items - Spelling

Our school is implementing PLD (Promoting Literacy Development) which includes a structured, synthetic phonics approach to teaching spelling. This approach is being rolled out across our whole school as it aligns with scientifically proven practices about the most effective ways to improve literacy. Information will continue to be provided to parents and carers during the year regarding PLD and the evidence-based practices that help our kids improve their learning.

As part of our whole school approach to improving spelling, we recently completed a diagnostic spelling assessment from Year 1 - 6 to identify any gaps in each student's spelling understanding. Spelling instruction, practice and lists will target each student's area of need. This week your child will come home with a spelling list targeted to their specific learning needs. During the week, students will complete lessons and activities designed to build their understanding about their focus spelling concept. Spelling practice at home will help to consolidate these skills. Thank you to all of our families for helping us to work towards our goal of creating confident, competent spellers.

TIME: 9:15am approximately

Event timetable: Preps (short course), Year 1 (short course), Year 2 (1km), Year 3 (1km), Age Groups 2012 (2km), 2011 (2km), 2010 (3km), 2009 (3km). Students are to wear appropriate footwear for running in.

We cannot specify the times for each event as we must wait until most students have completed the course before we start the next race

Students in the age groups 2009, 2010, 2011 will be eligible to represent our school in the Small Schools Championship being held at our school in Term 2, Week 1 on Friday 23rd April at 10:00am. *This will also depend on the times they run.
